The Taliban tried to make Malala silent, but it failed. Rather, it has only made her stronger. In July, 2013, on her 16th birthday, she made a speech at the UN in New York about the importance of education. She spoke about the child's bright future and the strength of their words. Few people take a risk for their beliefs. She said, "I am Malala. My world has changed but I have not." Nothing can prevent her dreams and hopes for girls' education.
